Clarification on the Indiana Application for Certification

ABMP has been contacted by several members who have experienced frustrating delays and who have received confusing notifications during the processing of applications for certification. We have contacted the board for clarification in the hopes of making the process go more smoothly. This is a new process in Indiana and we encourage everyone to be patient.

The majority of questions stem from the **Method of Obtaining Certification** section. The process for completing this is described below. It will help if you have the application in front of you as you read this explanation.

Read through the entire section **Method of Obtaining Certification** before filling it out. There are two major categories that may apply, though the options are somewhat confusing.

If you did not complete a 500-hour massage program but you have been practicing for at least two years, select the top box, then *one* of the top two boxes in that category to demonstrate that you have been practicing massage in Indiana.

Note that, as stated in the instructions, documentation of your work experience in Indiana is required and *must be notarized*.

If you have completed a 500-hour massage therapy program before January 1, 2008, the easiest way to apply is by checking the bottom box, as shown below. This applies regardless of residency or how long ago you graduated from your program. You must send a notarized copy of your diploma *or* your transcript; *whichever you send, it must show the length of your program in hours.*
